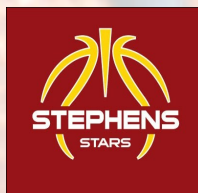

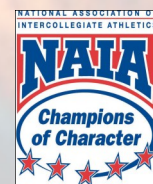

Stars coach Bill Bixon said both teams Stephens will face this weekend are tough, big, physical, strong squads that will provide a challenge for his young squad. In Grand View, the Stars will face a team that has played some good teams.

"This is going to be a great test for us to see where we are and what we're made of at this point in time," Bixon said. "I think it is going to be a true test of who we are and what we are capable of. But there is one thing I am sure of, I know we are going to compete our hardest and we'll let the shots fall where they may."

LAST TIME OUT: Stephens concluded a pair of home contests against JV squads from Central Methodist with a convincing

70-48 win over the Eagles' JV Green squad Tuesday in Silverthorne Arena. The Stars previously beat the Central Methodist JV White squad, 67-45 on Nov. 11.

On Tuesday, Stephens jumped out to a 9-0 lead to start the contest and never looked back. Freshman guard Logan Blagg led the Stars with 16 points, connecting on 3-of-6 shots from 3-point range. On the night, Blagg shot 50 percent from the field (4-of-8) and was perfect from the free-throw-line (5-of-5). Fellow freshman Haley Kahrs chipped in 11 and Megan Sheffield and Jessica McConnell each added nine.

The Stars had a balanced scoring attack with 12 players recording points. "I think we're still learning how to play together, but you saw flashes of what this group is capable of doing. Now being able to apply that to a more pressurized game and on a more consistent basis and eliminating some of the silly easy turnovers, those are the things that we need to strive to work on as a team. However, overall you learn that some of these girls are ready to step up and take advantage of some opportunities. They should all be proud of themselves."

SCOUTING GRAND VIEW UNIVERSITY:

No. 20 (NAIA D-II) Grand View University, 4-1, comes into the American State Bank Classic off of a pair of wins at the Midland University Tournament in Fremont, Neb. The Vikings downed Peru State to open the tournament, 86-51 then defeated Central Methodist, 71-50. Grand View, ranked No. 24 in NAIA pre-season polls started the season strong, knocking of a pair of top-ranked teams in Kansas Wesleyan (73-61) and No. 5 Briar Cliff, 67-58. The Vikings lone loss on the season came at the hands of No. 1 Northwestern College, 90-77.

Grand View senior guard Jenn Jorgensen (Dayton, Iowa) leads the Vikings in scoring with 23.4 points per game. Amy Voss is second with a 13.4 average, followed

closely by Morgan Hamner who chips in 13.2 a game. Jorgensen has been a beast on the boards, ripping down 10.4 per contest.

Jorgensen picked up the season's first Midwest Collegiate Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week honor after leading the Vikings wins last weekend over No. 4 Kansas Wesleyan and No. 5 Briar Cliff. The 2010-11 First Team All-American averaged 22 points and 10.5 rebounds and recorded a pair of double-doubles at the Grand View Shootout and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

SITY: Heading into the American State Bank Classic, the YellowJackets are 2-1, 2-0 at home. Graceland lost its season-opener to AIB, 80-71, but has rebounded to win two in a row — a 74-54 victory over Waldorf and a 82-48 thrashing of Clarke.

Adria Jackson paces Graceland with 19.67 points per game while Florida Siaois grabs 12 boards per game. Jamie Whitfield is the Yellowjackets' leader in steals (2.67 spg) and assists (3.67 apg).

STLCOP TIP-OFF CLASSIC: Stephens College dropped a 70-51 decision to AMC foe Hannibal-LaGrange at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy Tip-Off Classic. The Stars opened the season with an 84-26 thrashing of host school, STLCOP. In that game Stephens shot 49 percent from the floor (31-of-63); 61 percent from 3-

point range (8-of-13) and 93 percent from the free-throw line (14-of-15).

Stars coach Bill Bixon said the tournament gave his team an opportunity to learn several things over the course of the weekend.

"It gives us a good foundation to build this season. We gave everyone a lot of good experience and they all got a good feeling of what college basketball is all about.

FRESH FACES: A solid recruiting effort by second-year Stephens coach Bill Bixon adds nine freshmen for the 2011-12 season to better run his system. Joining Stephens are Katie Arnet (**St. Louis, Mo., Trinity Catholic High**), Rachel Barlow (**Hale, Mo., Hale High**), Logan Blagg (**Clinton, Ark., Clinton High**), Alex Greenwood (**Columbia, Mo., Christian Fellowship High**), Alex Hoffman (**Newburg, Mo., Newburg High**), Haley Kahrs (**Smithton, Mo., Smithton High**), Taylor Payne (**Columbia, Mo., Rock Bridge High**), Vanessa Rogers (**Windsor, Mo., Windsor High**), and Kylie Romig (**Tipton, Mo., Tipton High**).

The newcomers join retuning players Danielle Caldwell (**junior, Canton, Mo., Southeastern CC**), Davielle McCoy

(**sophomore, LaMonte, Mo., LaMonte High**), Megan Sheffield (**senior, Windsor, Mo., Windsor High**) and Kelsea Whitten (**sophomore, Gentry, Ark., Gentry High**), along with the return of Jessica MccConnell (**junior, Edwardsville, Ill., Edwardsville High**), an All-AMC honorable mention selection in 2009-10 as a freshman with the Stars who spent the 2010-11 season at University of Illinois-Springfield and Andie Young (**junior, Bosworth, Mo., Bosworth High**), who redshirted in 2010-11, to bring the Stars numbers to 15 players. A plethora as opposed to a year ago.

Coach Bill Bixon said with just their mere strength in numbers, the newcomers bring a "passion and enthusiasm for being here" that was lacking during his inaugural campaign. And that's not even taking into consideration the talent they possess.

"The pieces are in place," he acknowledged. "I felt like last year a lot of the lessons we learned were in a game situation out in front of everyone and some players didn't handle that very well. I'm hoping this year we can have more teaching moments and more learning experiences before we step on the floor just because we're able to practice 5-on-5 and we've got girls competing for positions, competing for playing time. Because in my mind everything is pretty much wide open."

SHEFFIELD NEARING POINTS, RE-

BOUNDING MILESTONE: Senior Megan Sheffield entered this season with 724 career points, just 276 shy of the millennium mark. Sheffield also is within reach of 1,000 rebounds in her illustrious career, having grabbed 666 boards, 334 off the mark. Sheffield scored nine points on Nov. 15 against Central Methodist to move her career total to 733.

SPORT TO SPORT: Following a first-round lost in the American Midwest Con-

ference Volleyball Tournament to eventual tourney champ, Missouri Baptist, senior Megan Sheffield join the Stars basketball team after leading the Stephens College volleyball team to a 12-26 overall record; 4-11.

Sheffield was an All-AMC honorable mention selection and was named to the conference's All-Academic squad.

Coach Bill Bixon describes Sheffield as the "heart and soul" of the squad. In addition to the double-double she averaged last season, her numbers in the NAIA's DI seem to back up that assertion. Sheffield ranked:

- No 6, Defensive rebounds Per Game (7.517)
- No 8, Total Rebounds Per Game (11.241)
- No. 13, Total Rebounds (326)
- No 22, Blocks Per Game (1.552)
- No. 25, Offensive Rebounds Per Game (3.724)

YOUNG AGAIN: Junior guard Andie

Young returns in 2011-12 after missing the 2010-11 season with a torn ACL suffered in the preseason. Young worked tirelessly rehabbing her knee and was even able to contribute last spring on the Stars softball squad.

"She's still working through the ups and downs of mentally getting through that hurdle of being back," Coach Bixon said of Young, who has completed coursework for her undergraduate degree and is currently pursuing a MBA.

SIXTH MAN: The Stars will be joined by a "Sixth Man" on the bench this season. Each game junior guard Jessica McConnell places a Tennessee Volunteers cap on a seat at the end of the team bench to honor her biggest fan, her father Corey, a huge Vols fan. Corey lost his 13-year battle with cancer in 2010 and the hat was given to McConnell by a

teammate to mark the anniversary of her father's death. Before she enters the game and each time she comes off the floor, McConnell touches the hat for luck.

STEPHENS PICKED 8TH IN AMC:

Columbia College earned the top spot in the 2011-12 American Midwest Conference women's basketball pre-season poll released by the league office. Earning the second seed in the pre-season ranking is last year's conference runner-up, William Woods University, which comes off one of the most successful seasons in school history, wrapping up the season with a 30-5 record and advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NAIA National Championships.

Park University finished the AMC regular season in 2010-11 tied for fourth place but will look to improve and are picked to finish third this season after an 18-11 record a year ago. Rounding out the rest of the AMC preseason picks are Williams Baptist College, selected to finish fourth in 2011-12; Missouri Baptist University fifth; first year head coach Caleb Harrison and Hannibal-LaGrange University are picked to finish sixth and Harris-Stowe State University seventh.

Stephens College rounds out the AMC in the eighth spot.

The AMC tournament begins February 29 with the quarterfinal round on campus sites, followed by a March 2 semifinal round, and the championship game will be played at the home court of the best remaining seed on March 5.
