Keynote Speaker Mimi Chakarova

Chakarova is a documentary photographer working on two long-term projects that examine the conflict in Kashmir and sex trafficking of women in Eastern Europe. In 2007, she became the series curator of FRONTLINE/World's photography series, FlashPoint. In 2008, Chakarova's work on sex trafficking was awarded a People's Voice Webby. She was also a 2008 nominee for a News & Documentary Emmy Award. Chakarova's work has appeared in National Geographic, The New York Times Sunday Magazine, The Atlantic Monthly, CBS News 60 Minutes, PBS FRONTLINE/World and the Center for Investigative Reporting among others. Chakarova is currently a correspondent at the Center for Investigative Reporting.
