Regionally, he wrote the score for *Poster Boy* at Williamstown Theatre Festival. Awards include two Tony Award nominations, two Drama Desk nominations, two "Best Plays" citations, the Kleban Award, and the Johnny Mercer Award. As a teacher of "acting through song," Craig taught renowned ongoing classes in New York for the Broadway community for close to three decades. His book, *The Reason to Sing: A Guide to Acting While Singing*, is used at numerous universities and conservatories throughout the country, including Stephens.

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


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
