#### **Director's Note**

What if somebody figured out that our economy is a doomsday machine?

What if somebody suddenly produced the information that if we continue to make money in the same way we always have, that our grandchildren are doomed?

Would the money-makers suddenly change their ways in consideration of the lives of those grandchildren?

Or would the money-makers silence the messenger, lie and obfuscate, and do whatever they have to do to keep making money?

I suspect we all know the answers to those questions, because we are experiencing that very thing.

An Enemy of the People is possibly the most timely play ever. The messengers keep coming. The mucky-mucks keep silencing them. Lies and obfuscation are endemic. The clock is ticking. And nothing substantive is changing.

... Or is it? The thing I love about this play is that it really is like a cliffhanger serial: the Defenders of Integrity fight for truth, but everyone turns against them, everything goes wrong that possibly could – and then, in the face of all that, the Stockmanns not only stay together but they make a plan – a good plan, to use education as a weapon against the lies and obfuscation. At the end, the strong may be lonely, but they remain a light of hope that one of these days, maybe before it's too late, voices emerging from schools like Dr. Stockmann's will succeed, and in the next episode of the Defenders of Integrity, our grandchildren may have a place to live after all.

An Enemy of the People leaves us with the clear message that it is not over till it is over.

And Ibsen's question resonates possibly more today than it did in 1883: Who is the *real* enemy?
