NEWS FROM ALUMNI

A Lifetime of Achievement...



Alana Smith Shepherd '49 was honored for Lifetime Achievement by the Atlanta Business Chronicle. The Award recognized the significant strides in her career, making a difference in her community, and blazing a trail for others.

Alana is the Chair of the Shepherd Center and one of the organization's founders. The Shepherd Center is a private, not-for-profit hospital specializing in medical treatment, research, and rehabilitation for people with spinal cord injury, brain injury, multiple sclerosis, spine and chronic pain, and other neuromuscular conditions.

It was established in 1975 following two years of rehabilitation for Alana's son James Shepherd who was injured and paralyzed from a bodysurfing accident in Brazil. Frustrated by the lack of rehabilitation care options in the Southwest, the Shepherd family hurled themselves into the task of creating a rehabilitation center. In its more than four decades, Shepherd Center has grown from a six-bed rehabilitation unit to a world-renowned, 152-bed hospital that treats more than 743 inpatients, 277 day-program patients, and more than 7,161 outpatients each year in more than 46,000 visits. Today, the Center is recognized by U.S. News as one of the nation's top 10 hospitals for rehabilitation.

More than a hospital, Shepherd Center also advocates for all people with disabilities. Shepherd has worked regionally to improve accessibility of rapid transit systems, sports complexes, airports, local businesses, and housing facilities. The hospital sponsors 11 wheelchair sports teams and has served as official sponsor of the Shepherd Center AJC Peachtree Road Race Wheelchair Division since 1984. Shepherd was also the founding sponsor of the 1996 Atlanta Paralympic Games, bringing 3,310 world-class athletes with disabilities from 104 nations to Atlanta for Olympic-level competition.

Although Shepherd Center has evolved greatly since 1975, it remains dedicated to helping people with catastrophic injuries and illnesses reclaim their lives with dignity, independence, and hope.

Alana was honored by Stephens College with the Alumnae Achievement Award in 1999. Join us in congratulating Alana again on her amazing lifetime of achievement!


Lives of Service...

Vice Admiral Nancy Brown '73 (Ret.) and Sergeant Star Cathcart, MSL '06

have been honored for their military service by Warrior Canine Connection. WCC is an organization that utilizes a Mission Based Trauma Recovery model to help recovering Warriors reconnect with life, their families, their communities, and each other. Warriors interact with dogs from birth through adulthood, training the dogs to act as service dogs for wounded warriors. Each service dog is named in honor of a veteran.

When **Jennifer Kelley Wilder '94,** WCC's Director of Development, learned about Stephens' <u>Mission Promise Kept</u> program for women veterans, a meaningful connection was established. WCC had a goal to honor more women veterans and Stephens College had a program to identify deserving candidates.

The first two are Vice Admiral Nancy and Sergeant Star.



United States Navy Vice Admiral Nancy Brown

grew up in Marion, Illinois. After graduating from Stephens, she followed the advice of her father and entered Officer Candidate School in 1974.

Highlights of her career included Command of the Naval Computer and Telecommunications Station in Cutler, Maine, and Naval Computer and Telecommunications Area Master Station Atlantic in Norfolk, Virginia. She served on the National Security Council staff at the White House and was Deputy Director of the White House

Military Office. In 2004, Vice Admiral Brown deployed to Iraq becoming the first Multi-National Force-Iraq C6. Returning in April 2005 she was assigned as the J6 for both North American Aerospace Defense Command and United States Northern Command.

After 35-years of service, Vice Admiral Brown retired as Director, Command, Control, Communications and Computer Systems, The Joint Staff. She is a proud member of the Stephens College Board of Trustees, serving as Chair of the Academic Affairs Committee. She has been a key member of the Mission Promise Kept advisory committee. She also serves as Vice Chair for the Veterans Honor Flight organization, and she was instrumental in organizing the first Honor Flight supported by Southern Illinois.



United States Marine Corps Sergeant Star Cathcart, an eight-year Veteran, embodies the true spirit of service and dedication to the Veteran community. Her journey began in Miramar, California, where she served as an Aviation Electronics Technician for the FA-18. After her honorable service, Sergeant Cathcart embarked on a path of impactful roles, including Operations Director of a homeless shelter for Veterans and Program Manager for Team Red, White, and Blue.

Currently, as the Lead Transformation Project Manager for Kyndryl, Sergeant Cathcart's commitment to fostering inclusive workplace cultures and amplifying the voices of Veterans shines brightly. Collaborating with esteemed organizations like the NFL and Starbucks, she has become a driving force in empowering Veterans and promoting their successful transition. Sergeant Cathcart's impact extends beyond her professional endeavors. As a Certified Peer Support Specialist, she provides invaluable assistance to Veterans battling MST and PTSD. Her expertise as a PTSD/trauma-informed yoga teacher brings healing and solace to those in need. Additionally, Sergeant Cathcart's dedication to supporting women struggling with addiction and mental health issues showcases her passion for uplifting marginalized communities.

Throughout her remarkable journey, Sergeant Cathcart's strategic leadership skills and unwavering dedication to disabled Veterans have set her apart. This recognition not only celebrates her exceptional qualifications but also inspires disabled Veterans to overcome challenges and thrive in their post-service lives. Sergeant Cathcart, a Veteran, leader, and advocate, has dedicated her life to empowering the Veteran community.

WCC says the outstanding contributions of these two Stephens women make them exemplary candidates for this prestigious recognition. Stephens College agrees!

A Special Gathering for MFA Alumni...








Dawnavyan M. James '15 announces that her book "Beyond February: Teaching Black History Any Day, Every Day, and All Year Long" will publish on October 31, 2023.

Drawing on her experiences as a classroom teacher and a Black history researcher, Dawnavyan illustrates the big and small ways that we can center Black history in everyday teaching and learning practices across curriculum using read-alouds, music, historical documents, art, and so much more. She has taught students from kindergarten to fifth grade, but her favorite years of teaching were her three years with kindergartners. She is currently pursuing her Ph.D. at the University at Buffalo and is a fellow at the Center for K-12 Black History and Racial Literacy Education.

Dawnavyn is also the founder of The Black History Club, an organization that empowers and equips teachers and students with information and resources that will benefit themselves, their families, and the community through engaging with Black histories.





Grace Hayden AA '88 shares her story about becoming a storyteller. While at Stephens, English instructor **Dick Caram** encouraged her to pursue writing.
